At today's public hearing, a variety of study information is provided, including full copies of the Draft Tier 1 EIS that you can view as well as an overview video summarizing the Draft Tier 1 EIS, along with printed materials and maps. In addition, technical staff is available to answer your questions and provide information about this study and its recommendations.

I hope it will be helpful. If you need any additional information, just look around; many staff members are on hand to help.

Your input is very important and we hope you will take advantage of opportunities to comment on the Draft Tier 1 EIS presented at today's public hearing.

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STUDY OVERVIEW

The I-11 Draft Tier 1 Environmental Impact Statement and Preliminary Section 4(f) Evaluation (Draft Tier 1 EIS) builds upon a previous study completed in 2014: the I-11 and Intermountain West Corridor Study. That study identified the I-11 Corridor as a critical transportation facility that would diversify, support, and connect the economies of Arizona and Nevada.

In December 2015, Congress approved the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act, which formally designates I-11 as an interstate freeway throughout Arizona.

The I-11 Tier 1 EIS process, conducted in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) allows the study to move forward before funding is established for future project development. It lays the groundwork for where the corridor would be located, analyzes and evaluates possible corridor alternatives, and documents the analysis.


The Tier 1 EIS process will select either:

- (1) a 2,000-foot-wide Build Corridor Alternative; or
- (2) the No-Build (or do-nothing) Alternative.

It's important to understand that this Tier 1 EIS process is evaluating potential corridors, NOT specific alignments within those corridors.

If FHWA and ADOT select a Build Alternative, it would be implemented in segments as funding becomes available. Each segment would undergo a Tier 2 environmental study. Tier 2 is a deeper analysis that would produce detailed design, identify property impacts, and define more specific and detailed mitigation measures.

ADOT and FHWA will consider all comments and questions in preparing the Final Tier 1 EIS, which will include responses to all comments, final conclusions on potential impacts, and ADOT's and FHWA's decision on the Preferred Alternative (either a Build Corridor Alternative or the No-Build Alternative).

PUBLIC STATEMENT AREA GUIDELINES

General guidelines for speaker registration and participation are listed below. Please note that the panel of study team members is there to listen, but will not respond to questions or comments. Study discussions or questions and answers are accommodated in the open house area of the meeting. The moderator has the authority to deviate from these procedures, if needed.

- Register All speakers are required to register by signing up at the Speaker Registration table. Speaker registration is available until the designated closing time for the hearing. For Tucson and Marana meetings only: pre-registration is available in advance of the hearing online at https://tinyurl.com/i11study (you can select a specific time) or by calling 1.844.544.8049.
- 2. Order of speakers Speakers will be called forward based on the order in which they sign up.
- 3. Time limit for verbal comments In order to allow as many to be heard as possible and provide equal opportunity, each speaker will be allotted a maximum of 3 minutes.
- Submit written comments An individual or group representative who speaks may also submit more detailed written comments for the hearing record. All comments – regardless of how submitted – will have equal weight.
- 5. Cannot yield time To allow equal opportunity for all and to accommodate the number of people who may wish to speak, yielding time to another person will not be allowed.
- 6. Format The public statement area is to receive 3-minute verbal comments; study discussions or questions and answers are accommodated in the open house area of the meeting.
- 7. No demonstrations Demonstrations are not allowed at the public hearing.
- 8. Hearing schedule All speakers registered to speak by the scheduled close of the hearing will have the opportunity to speak. Registration will not be allowed past the closing time of the hearing.

What happens after the Draft Tier 1 EIS comment period ends?

After July 8, 2019 (the end of the Draft Tier 1 EIS comment period), the study team will review and address all comments and questions received, regardless of how they are submitted, in the Final Tier 1 EIS document.

The Final Tier 1 EIS will identify a Preferred Corridor Alternative (either a Build Corridor Alternative or the No-Build Alternative). When the Final Tier 1 EIS is complete, it will be released for a minimum 30-day public review period. Then, FHWA will issue a Record of Decision that identifies a Selected Alternative (either a Build Corridor Alternative or the No-Build Alternative).

If a Build Corridor Alternative is selected, when will a specific route for I-11 be identified?

It's important to note that if a Build Corridor Alternative is identified as the Selected Alternative, the specific location of the highway (approximately 400 feet wide) within that 2,000-foot corridor will be identified through subsequent Tier 2 studies on the specific alignment. The Tier 2 studies would be conducted when funding is available.

Who makes the final decision on what alternative is selected?

The final decision on the Selected Alternative is a cooperative effort involving ADOT and FHWA. ADOT serves as the agency responsible for implementation of the plan, with FHWA providing the federal oversight. FHWA is the lead federal agency responsible for implementing the requirements of NEPA, the governing federal law, and is responsible for the ultimate decision regarding the proposed action.

How is public input used?

Public comments are a vital component in the decision-making process. Public comment has been solicited from project inception and through key milestones in the Tier 1 EIS process. The interests and needs of the public, along with all other social, economic, and environmental issues and impacts, must be fully analyzed and included in the Draft and Final Tier 1 EIS and the ROD. Comments made during development of the Draft Tier 1 EIS have been used to adjust alternatives, explore new questions, or make changes—all within the scope of NEPA. Public comments received on the Draft Tier 1 EIS will be reviewed and responded to in the Final Tier 1 EIS document.
